

This gut bathroom remodel was completed in early 2021 in the Killearn Lakes neighborhood. The big change in this bathroom was removing the large garden tub to create a barrier-free shower for two. We also removed the popcorn ceiling, replaced all the flooring, updated the electric, and installed a new vanity and countertop.

The homeowners chose Belmont's Tivoli door style in a painted finish called Pepper. In the vanity, we added a docking drawer for outlets to make for more convenient electronic storage. The quartz countertops are from Cambria in the color Smithfield, a soft white with faint veins and an eased edge profile. For optimal storage and a unique design element, rather than install two sinks, we installed a single 33" porcelain sink with two faucets.

A new window added plenty of natural light while still offering the privacy necessary for a bathroom. We installed simple bar lights over the vanity: one over the sink, one over the seated area, and sconce lights on either side of the sink area for extra light. We also added a toe kick light for an accent, which also makes for a great night light. Finally, we added a lighted makeup mirror.

The shower has two shower heads, each with its own valve to adjust the temperature and pressure settings. With the help of our designer, the homeowners got creative with the tile and it's easily our favorite part of the project. The shower wall tile is a 3D tile called Donna Wave Deco from Bedrosian Tile. The accent tile on the wet wall is Azul Gloss from Emser tile. Because the shower is barrier-free and has a linear drain we were able to use the same floor tile throughout the bathroom and the shower: a 24"x24" tile called Metro Long Island, also from Bedrosian Tile. The wall color is Sherwin Williams' First Star. The doors and trim were done in High Reflective White from Sherman Williams.
